Morning Keynote - Imagine What Math Can Make Possible

Dr. Zandra de Araujo – Director of Mathematics, Lastinger Center for Learning, University of Florida

Mathematics is an outlet for human curiosity, creativity, and imagination. Throughout history, mathematical ideas have helped us understand our world and create things once thought impossible, from modern computing to artificial intelligence. This keynote explores how cultivating the wonder and power of mathematics can unlock human potential, expand economic opportunity, and build the creative, adaptable workforce our future demands.

Speed Session: Rethinking the Math Pathway – HB 1279 and Florida's Future

Florida's future workforce will require more students to see mathematics not as a barrier, but as a pathway to opportunity. Representative Jennifer Kincart Jonsson shares the thinking behind HB 1279 and its move toward more relevant, career-connected math pathways for Florida students. This fast-paced conversation explores why connecting math to students' futures matters, and what it could mean for Florida's talent pipeline, communities and economy.
